I asked a resident nurse, and she took me to his personal room and there I spoke to Art about his hunting stories. Before I left, I asked to pray for him, and he was happy to let me and then told me how much he appreciated my visit. That touched my heart more than he'll ever know. I thanked the Lord for letting me have some time

with Art that day. I hope to see him in the banquet hall next time.

How about you? What ministry would you like to be a part of today? Is there one you tried in the past that you thought wasn't for you? Try it again, you won't know until you do. We want to challenge you to take a step of faith and to move in a direction and allow the Lord to direct your path. We know He has some wonderful plans on how your life can impact others for Jesus Christ.
